

International Air Passenger Traffic (Per thousand person)






- Brunei International Airport (BIA) is the only international airport.

- Motor vehicles further classified as ICE, EV or hybrid vehicles.




Land - Road Traffic Accidents

Road Traffic Accidents











Maritime - International Sea Cargo Throughput
